"It could be tonight, tomorrow, or sometime next year. Only the Lord knows."

As a teenager, Johnny Wilson must have heard the Good News about Jesus Christ at least four times a week. During his senior year in high school, every Monday through Thursday he was confronted by a Christian classmate named James Milton.

Each day in the school's gym, Milton would tell him, "Tomorrow isn't promised to anyone!" Then he'd say, "You know, Johnny, since you don't know the future, why not accept Christ now while you can?"
